Thursday, 4 Jan 1900 William F Arnold

William F Arnold, born in Hendrix Co. Indiana 30 Dec 1828 and died at 4:40 A.M. 29 Dec 1879. Mr Arnold moved to Jones Co. Ia. in 1849. On 13 Nov 1852 ne married Miss Orphie Alspaugh, daughter of Mr. and Mrs Samuel Alspauch of this county; they had 7 children, 4 sons and 3 daughters. 2 sons and 1 daughter preceded the father to the realms beyond. The wife, 2 sons, William F and Samuel S, 2 daughters, Mrs. Emma A Packard and Mrs Jennie M. Quinn together with their adopted daughter survive.

Funeral was at the Christian Church in Martelle at 11 A.M. Sunday, Mr Arnold was burried in Forest Chapel Cemetary. Sermon was preached by Rev. W.S. Johnson, pastor of the Christian Church. Pall bearers were James Armstrong, C. H. Ormsby, David English, Charles Chapin, C.L. Holcomb and H.D. McConaughy.

Mr Arnold was one of the earliest pioneers of Greenfield Twp. Mrs Arnold will move to Manilla Ia. where she will make her home with her son Milliam F. Jr.

Thursday; Jan 1, 1900 Monticello Times
1ST COUPLE MARRIED IN JONES COUNTY MR AND MRS THOMAS J. PEAK CELEBRATE THEIR 60TH
WEDDING ANIVERSARY.

On Christmas day, Dec 25 1899, Mr and Mrs f. J. Peak of Monticello celebrated their 60th wedding aniversary.

Mr Peak was born at Jaffery N.H. 9th September 1813 where he lived 7 years. He remained in the east untill 23 years of age and in 1826 moved west stopping at Chicago during the presidential election. His family were residents of Illinois for a short time. It was while living in Buffalo Grove, Ill. that he became aquainted with Rebecca M. Beardsley, now his wife, whose family were formerly residents of Andes N.Y. The Beardsleys moved to Illinois in 1836.

In 1837 the male representatives of the 2 families came to this vicinity and staxed out farms a few miles west of here. they built cabins and their wives and children came the next spring.

In 1839 Mr and Mrs Peak were married, being the 1st couple in the county to marry. They lived on the farm till 1863 when they moved to Monticello. Mr. Peak was an active citizen in public affairs and has occupied nearly all the public offices in the city and county. Their oldest son william V. died in 1864, the other sons and daughters are; Frances E. now Mrs. William Hogg, Monticello, Maria A, Mrs. Wm. Mosa, Elspeth R. Mrs Edwin Price, of Rockford Ia. and Andrew J. Peak. All those were present except the last named who is engaged in the mining business in the western states.

Thursday 11 Jan 1900 Monticello Iowa

Ar I.J. Peak, resident of Jones Co. for 61 years, died at his nome yeaterday. Mr Peak had been ill about a week with pneumonia but was recovering. His death was due to heart trouble. Mr. Peak was over 86 years of age. He settled in Jones Co and entered 100 acres of land. He farmed for 25 years and accumulated 400 acres of land. He was at one time engaged in the lumber business in Monticello and also ran a grocery store for 10 years.

Please! If you know of any persons who are burried in the Jones County cemetaries but do not have markers, the committee would appreciate the information. We would like to have the lists as complete as possible by the time we assemble the book for publication.

WALNUT GROVE CEMETARY

Rome township Section 28

Walnut Grove (Methodist Church) and Cemetary is at the top of a hill/just South of the intersection. The entrance is accessable only through a pasture. The stones are almost hidden by weeds and asparagus. The church was destroyed sometime after 1915.

The first burial was Sarah Grafft 1877. J. S. Grafft owned property on 3 sides of the cemetary untill 1915.
