

Jones County was divided into voting precincts in 1840



Bowen Prairie; present day Castle Grove, Cass, Wayne, Lovell and Richland. Farm Creek; present day washington, Clay and Scotch Grove. Buffalo Fork; present day Fairview and Greenfield. Walnut; present Jackson, Madison, Wyoming, Rome, Hale and Oxford

On July 5 1842 the townshops were formed and renamed. Walnut to dome; Buffalo Fork to Fairview; Farm Creek to Washington; Bowen Prairie to dichland.

3 Apr 1844; Clay two was formed and included the present Wyoming, the part of present Clay south of the Maquoketa Miver and all of Scotch Grove south of the river and a l mile strip of eastern Wayne Two.

10 June 1847; Monticello Twp was separated from Richland Twp. Included all of Monticello south of the river and covered the territory of the present Lovell, Wayne, Cass and Castle Grove Twp.

1847; Greenfield Twp was organized with its present boundries.

21 Apr 1848; Cass and Nayne were separated from Monticello and attached to Fairview fownship.

July 1851; Hale two was organized and included the townships of Hale and Oxford. Jackson Two was organized and included the townships of Madison and Jackson.

1 Mar 1852; Cass township was separated from Monticello.


8 Feb 1854; Pierce township separated from Clay, The name was changed to Wyoming in 1856.

1 Jan 1855; Castle Grove separated from Monticello and Monticello Twp extended across the river to the northern boundry of the county.

l Jan 1855; Madison Twp organized Feb 1855; Scotch Grove separated from Clay Mar 1855; Oxford separated from Hale 5 Mar 1856; Wayne set off from Fairview.

Did you know? Adam Overaker hat the first ferry across the Wapsipinicon R. at Newport in 1847. He charged 25 cents for a 2 horse vehicle and $12\frac{1}{2}$ cents for a 1 horse vehicle. The cost for a pedestrian was 6 cents.

GENEALOGY POX

(VERY CONTAGIOUS TO ADULTS)

- SYMPTOMS: Continual complaint as to need for names, dates and places. Patient has bland expression, sometimes deaf to spouse and children. Has no taste for work of any kind, except feverishly looking through records at libraries and courthouses. Has compulsion to write letters. Swears at mailman when he doesn't stop and leave mail. Frequents strange places such as cemeteries, ruins and remote, desolate country areas. Makes secret night calls. Hides phone bills from spouse and mumbles to self. Has strange faraway look in eyes.
- TREATMENT: Medication is useless. There is no KNOWN CURE. Disease is not fatal, but gets progressivly worse. Patient should attend genealogy workshops, subscribe to genealogical magazines and be given a quient corner in the house where he or she can be alone.

Did you know? Newport was chosen for county seat in 1845. Adam Overaker gave 10 acres for the townsite, at a sherriffs sale 20 lots were sold, plans were made for a log courthouse but nothing was done to complete it.

Mrs David Osborn, Cass Twp. wied 18 Feb 1899. She was sorn Anna Keen, Kings Co Ireland Jan 1831. At age 14 she moved to America. Was married in Springfield Mass. in Aug 1853 to David Osborn. David was born in Chickopee Mass. They moved to Anamosa in Aug 1855. Had 7 Children; Louisa, Jessie and Emma died young. Ella and Adella were unmarried at the time of their mothers death. Sons Louis and William. Burried in Anamosa Cemetary.

Obit;

Mayy M. Packard, d. 19 Feb 1899. Born Alsace France, 2 Apr 1821, came to New York City at age 6 then to Oneida Co N.Y. later moved to Hardin Co. Ohio. Married 15 Jan 1848 to Leonard Packard, Came to Iowa 1854 to Jackson Twp. Mr Packard died 21 Nov 1862. Children: Olivia and Lafayette died in Ohio. Ellis died in Iowa, Milton died in the east. Three survive, Mrs Marietta Boots, Anamosa; Clinton, Cedar Mapids; Laura Jane Mc Kenzie, East Bay, Florida. Mary was half sister to Anthony and Barney Waggoner, and was a member of Antioch Christian Church.
