JOHN MERRITT

John Merritt was born in Ovid, Seneca Co., New York in 1806. He moved to Orleans Co. before starting his migration to Iowa on the 11th of Dec. 1836. He arrived in Jones Co. 9 Nov 1837 and settled in Section 3 of mome fownship where he purchased 754 acres. He belonged to the Methodist Church and Republican party.

He married 1st, 30 Sept 1827, Catherine Culp who was born in Pennsylvania in 1800 and died 14 dec 1855. Their seven children were Horatio, no further information; Agnes, married 9 Oct 1852, Mathias Houstman. Mathias was born 22 Nov. 1826 and died 14 Jan 1900. They had a daughter Agnes, born 12 May 1880, died 25 March 1900; Joseph married Rebecca Merritt in March of 1853.

Jerome J. born 4 Jec 1835 and died 8 Sept. 1919, married Rebecca Blayney, born 25 June 1837 in Ohio and died 30 May 1905. They had 8 children; James, Miranda, born 1859 and died 30 Aug 1891; Mary, Augustus, Augusta, died 1877, Don Carlos, Erwin, and Dellis.

William Merbitt, born 15 Oct 1836, died 29 May 1915, is buried in Merritt Cemetery. He married Elizabeth Kelly 25 Dec 1860.

Dollie Merritt, born 9 Jan 1842, died 29 Apr 1863, married John Wesley Lyon Se. 1 Jan 1860. They had two sons, John Wesley Jr who married Fannie Lucinda Erickley; and Cornelius Merritt Lyon who married Caroline Sherman, 27 Nov 1886. John Wesley Jr was born 1861 and Cornelius was born 6 Feb. 1863 and died 11 Nov. 1919. John W. Sr. married 2nd Mary Hope Chew.

Cornelius Mærritt, born 1841, died 5 July 1911, married Elizabeth Newell 2 July 1866. He served in the Civil War and is buried in the Merritt cemetery.

John Merritt married 2nd Caroline Dunlap about 1855. Caroline was born 20 Oct 1827 and died 16 Feb 1905. Fheir children were; Love or Vilcie, born 9 Mar 1857, died 15 Aug 1915, buried at Riverside, married S.O. Hay 14 Act 1876; Malinda, born 10 Oct 1858, married Frank A. Beyely 16 Mar 1879 and died 20 June 1896. Frank was born 1851 died 1929. both are buried at Center Cemetery; Elmer; Deligha, born 1833, married Humphrey Bailey 21 Feb 1869 and flied 1875, Humphrey born 1822 and died 1889, buried at Cass Cemetery; Hiram Sherman, born 1865, m. Mary Belle Lamb 16 Nov 1886 at the residence of G.W. Lamb. diram died 7 Jan 1949 and Mary b. 1866 died 29 Aug 1952 buried at Center Cemetery; Charles Willis; Cordelia, born 11 Aug 1870, married Ulysses Grant Byerly 19 Nov 1889 at W.Z. Fallman residence died 22 April 1942, buried at Center Cemetery. Ulysses was born 11 Aug 1866 and died 10 Apr 1915.

John Merritt died 1 Dec 1886 and Caroline died 16 Feb 1904. They are buried in Merritt Family Cemetery.

ANAMOSA EUREKA: Centenial Edition, 1938 Allen Scroggs was born in Steubenville, Ohio in 1838 and 10 years later went overland with his family to Cincinnatti, and snipped on a steamer down the Ohio river to the Mississippi river. They changed steamers at St. Louis and came up the Mississippi river to Camanche, Iowa. Thence they came overland and moved to what is now Anamosa.

The family stayed a few days in Grockwell hotel, they had orought with them some medicine and drugs, they moved into a house across the street from the hotel and started a drug store. He bought from the government the land lying north of Main street and west of Garnavillo street and later he built a home. In 1854 he sold his drug store to J.S. Dimmit, grandfather of Mallie Illis. AMAMOSA JOURNAL: 16 FEB 1933; AGED MONTICELLO WOMAN FROZEN TO DEATH IN BED

The frozen body of Mrs. John Holmes of Monticello was found in bed at her home in Bowens Prairie and her husband, unconscious and almost frozen was found by her side by a neighbor last Thursday. Ars. Holmes is well over 60 years of age.

Mr. Holmes who is 60 years of age is in the Monticello Hospital in critical condition. Mrs. Holmes, an invalid, was cared for by her husband. They lived on a small farm. The fire in the home had gone out and it is believed Mrs. Holmes died Wednesday night and that her husband was unable to leave his bed.

Neighbors investigated late Thursday when they saw no smoke coming from the chimney. Mrs. Holmes, a former postmistress at Bowen's Prairie, was one of the early settlers of the county.

Died at her home at Anamosa, June 22, 1930 at the age of 48 years, 7 months and 25 days. She came to the United States with her parents when only an infant of 5 months. Most of her life was spent at Sioux City, Iowa.

She was united in marriage to Arthur Lister in April 13, 1908. To this union were born two daughters, Agatha and Phylis.

Mrs Lister had been in poor health for about three years, and for the past three months has been confined to her bed. She was a very patient sufferer and always seemed much more concerned about the comforts of her family than her own weakened body.

Mrs Lister was a member of the Presbyterian cnurch at Sioux City and also a member of the Episcopal Guild at Anamosa.

She leaves to mourn their loss beside her husband and two daughters, her father, who resides at Sioux City, Iowa; five brothers and sistere; Ars. G.J. Sawyers, Sioux City; Ars C.A. Kolhoff of Council Bluffs, Iowa; Hobert of Omaha, Nebr; Miss Mary AcClean, Sioux City and Hobert of Houston, fexas. Bes Besides many friends and neighbors.

Funeral services were held at the home Fuesday afternoon, Rev. D.A. Beggs of the local Congregational church officiating. Mrs A.J. Crispin and Mrs. D.A. Beggs furnished two vocal numbers, with Melville Brown accompanist. Interment was made at Riverside Cemetery.

MRS. U. Z. KENDALL: Hannah Jane Stickley, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Horace Stickley was born in Jackson County, Iowa, January 18, 1858 and passed away at ner home in Anamosa, Iowa, June 19, 1930 at the age of seventy-two years, five months and one day. Although Mrs Kendall had not been in good health for the past six months, yet her last illness was of only ten days duration.

February 15, 1880 she was united in marriage to U.Z. Kendall at Emeline, Iowa. To them were corn eight children. Two children preceded the mother in death. Frankie, aged three months and a daughter, Mrs Stella Townsend died October 22, 1927.

At the time of her death, Mrs Kendall was not a member of any church although in girlhood she had been a member of The Dunkers. The husband who has not been well for more than four years was unable to attend the funeral services. Mrs Kendall's passing is the last survivior of the Horace Stickley family, once a pioneer family of Jackson County.

The deceased is survived by her ausband, U.Z. Kendall and the following children; James, at home, Mrs Oscar Ketchum of Marengo, Icwa; Mrs. Alta Manley of Cedar mapids; Mrs. Ella Cook at home; Mrs John Dakers of Wheaton, Minn; Clifford of Anamosa, also a son, Leander Brown of Salem S.D. who is the child of a former marriage. She is also survived by twenty-six grand children and three great-grandchildren.
