The following are brief nistories of some of the churches in Jones County. They were originally printed in the Monticello Express Easter Edition, 1988.

. SCOTCH GROVE PRESBYTERIAN: Scotch Grove Township

A group of 12 pioneers met in a log cabin with Rev. Michael Mummer, a circuit rider, and organized the Scotch Grove Presbyterian cauron in June 1841. It was first known as "The First Church of Edenburgh".

Services were held in homes until the first church building was erected in 1851. The present building was built and dedicated in 1861. The pioneer Scots, remembering the church which they had loved, modeled the building after the one in their homeland.

Early in the century the tall steeple, containing the bell installed in 1880, weakened and had to be repaired. In 1941, the church was presented with a furnace which necessitated the addition of a partial basement. Other remodeling was done at that time.

With the passage of time the stone foundation settled and the sills deteriorated. In 1954, realizing that something must be done to save the building, the congregation voted to move the building 25 feet and set it upon a full basement. A kitchen, dining room and modern restrooms were then added.

Remodeling was undertaken in 1957 when the interior was redecorated. In 1966, a new communion table, pulpit, pulpit chair, pews and hymn books were purchased and dedicated, and new tile flooring laid. On Oct 30, 1966, the 125th anniversary of the church was celebrated and the 135th on June 27, 1976.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CATHOLIC CHURCH: Castle Grove.

The Immaculate Conception Catholic Parish at Castle Grove dates back to 1854. Several Names of the pioneers are on record as founders of the church and immigrants of the times.

The present church structure was erected in 1877. The original log church was destroyed by fire. A second structure built in 1867 was concerted to a school building and was in use until 1969.

The present parish house was built in 1910. With additions and improvements, it has served the parish through the years.

Immaculate Conception Cemetery dates back over a century. Many relatives and friends of the pioneers come to visit the cemetery to pay their respects and other prayers for the honored dead.

The subject of this notice was a daughter of Rev. Joseph Johnson, and was married to John McMurrin on the 2sth of March, 1874, was the mother of four children, all living. She embraced the Christian religion some eight or nine years ago, and with her husband, united with the United Brethren in Christ at Forest Chapel, since which time she has been an acceptable member until death. She was an honored member of the Ladies' Aid Society of that place, being president of the same at the time of her death. She was rational to the last moment of life, and conversed freely with all that visited her room, and died triumphantly. She was laid to rest in the Forest Cemetery, March 31, a very large procession witnessing the scene. Peace to her ashes. The funeral services were conducted by the writer.

ALBERT C. McMURRIN DEAD

Albert C. McMurrin passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Wm. McCullough in Des Moines, on January 24th. 1936

He was born in Greenfield twp., July 13, 1862, at the old McMurrin estate. He grew to manhood in that vicinity.

He attended business college at Davenport, Iowa. After his marriage, a home was established at Cherokee. After the death of his wife, he made his home with his only child.

He made annual visits back to his home and returned from one of these visits just a week before

his death.

Funeral services were held at
Des Moines and short services at
Oherokee, where interment was
made beside his wife. His brother
James of Anamosa and a nephew,
Dewey McMurrin of Marion, attended the funeral.
