Burial was in Rose Hill cemetery, Mechanicsville.

### OBITUARY

Tena E. Melton, daughter of Amos and Maria Kohl was born in Jones county, July 21, 1871. She was the last of a family of nine children, there being four sisters and four brothers preceding her in death.

She grew to womanhood in the White Oak community and united with the Evangelical church there.

She was united in marriage to George J. Melton on April 27, 1890. They began housekeeping on the Amos Kohl farm in the same community, later moving to a farm east of Mechanicsville. To this union two daughters were born, Alma Simpson who preceded her in death on November 1, 1924 and Mildred Nightingale of Cedar Rapjids, Iowa.

In 1914 they retired from the farm, and moved to Mechanicsville where she attended the Methodist church.

Mrs. Melton was a great lover of flowers, and spent her spare time in her garden. She was a 'devoted wife and mother. Her husband preceded her in death on March 9, 1945. She leaves to mourn her departure, a daughter Mildred Nightingale and a grand daughter Mildred Oldorf, and three Freat grand children, Glenn, Larry and Edith Oldorf. # Funeral Service For George J. Melton

George J. Melton life long resident of this community passed away after a brief illness. Son of Robert and Nancy Zimmerman Melton was born in Jones County, Ia., April 12, 1867 and passed away March 9th at 1 o'clock Friday morning, at the age of almost 78 years, in St. Luke's Methodist hospital in Cedar Rapids.
