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ANAMOSA EUREKA: 4 March 1869.  
DIED 25 Aug 1868 at Fairview, Jones Co. Iowa. Information given by son Dr. Clark Joslin. John Gaines Joslin, born Pittstown, Rensselaer Co. N.Y., 6 Oct 1794 and was 73 years 10 months of age at his death. Burial in Anamosa Cemetary. Funeral at the Baptist Church in Fairview by Rev. N.B. Homan. Mr Joslin was orphaned at age 6 years, lived with an uncle and other relatives untill age 14. Went to Ontario Co. N.Y. till Nov 1811 then to Huron Co. Ohio. He was a soldier in the 1st U.S. Inf Reg, Capt J.R. Reeds Co. Served about 6 mo. Stationed at Fort Meigs, Ohio. Granted bounty land warrent of 160 acres. Went to Cayunoga Co. Ohio, married and settled on a farm in the town of Bricksville, 16 miles south of Cleveland. He farmed untill the autumn of 1827, moved with his wife, 4 sons and 1 daughter to Washtenaw Co. Mich. He was a member of the Baptist Church. Aug 29 1837 he again moved, with his wife, 6 sons and 2 daughters, to Jones Co near Fairview. In 1850 Mr Joslin and sons, Daniel and Thurston, went to California to search for gold. They reached Georgetown Ca. 7 Oct 1850. Without success in finding gold they returned home via the Isthmus in May 1851. He then resumed farming. Sons Harrison and Daniel served in the Army during the Civil war and died in service of their country.
