RODNEY REMINGTON

Rodney E. Remington, son of the late Gardner and Sara Remington, was born at Licking County, Ohio, May 12, 1850, and died at his farm home Southwest of Anamosa, Friday morning, February 19, 1937, at the age of 86 years, nine months and seven days.

When a small child his parents located at Broadhead, Wisconsin, and at the age of 18 years he accompanied his parents to Iowa City, IA. Two years later they purchased a farm south of Anamosa where they located. He had continued to reside in this neighborhood through the years.

He was married October 23, 1878 to Miss Ida L. Starkweather at Fairview. Ten children were born to this union; one daughter died in infancy, and John met his death on the highway when hit by a passing car on November 15, 1931.

Mr. Remington had been in failing health since his wife died a year and seven months ago. He has been cared for during these months of invalidism by his daughter Katie, who has been tireless in ministering to her aged father.

He leaves to mourn his passing the following children: James, who resides at Olin, Mrs. Katie Leeper; Mrs. Earl Larson; R. E., Jr.; Mrs. Eugene Newhard and Fred, all of Anamosa; Frank and Harry both of Martelle; 20 grandchildren, eight great grandchildren and one sister, Mrs. Jennie Pattee, Sac City, Iowa. There are also many neighbors and friends.

The Rev. David M. Beggs, pastor of the Congregational church had charge of the services which were conducted at the Beam and Miller Funeral Chapel, Monday afternoon. Mrs. D. M. Beggs and Miss Florence Hale sang two numbers, and Mrs. O. M. Milles presided at the organ. Interment was at Norwich Cemetery. The pallbearers were Arthur and Herbert Leeper; Harold and Ray Larson; Glendon. (the last line of this obit is missing in the scrapbook.)

LYDIA M. GRASSFIELD.

Lydia M. Day was born Aug. 21, 1840 in township of Moore, Kent. Can. passed out of life on Jan. 28, 1911, aged 70 years 4 months and 29 days. She was united in marriage with David Grassfield on March 22, 1855, coming to Paris, Linn Co. in 1856. later to Jones Co., making her home here until her decease.

Mrs. Grassfield was the mother of eleven children, six of whom are living. The funeral was held at Fairview church on Tuesday, at one o'clock, conducted by Rev. F. P. Shaffer, which was attended by a large number of relatives and friends. She was laid to rest in the Wilcox cemetery.

ADELIA SOPER

After several weeks illness, Mrs. Adelia Soper died at her late home in Viola Sunday at 2 a. m. January 29, 1911. The funeral services were held Tuesday, Jan. 31 at 10:30 in the Methodist church at Viola. Rev. Chas. H. Scheik, pastor of the Baptist church at Anamosa officiated. 2 Timothy 4;6, 7, 8, were the text of the sermon. They had been chosen by Mrs. Soper. She selected them because her husband had done so just before he was taken in 1891.

Relatives and friends filled the church. Two hymns "Shall We Meet Beyond the River", and "God be With You Till We Meet Again", were sung by the quartet choir of the church. The burial was at the Norwich cemetery. The cemetery was a part of the farm on which Deacon and Mrs. Soper lived when married. The cemetery was named after the town in New York State from which Mrs. Soper's parents came when she was twelve years old.

She was born January, 1885. At the age of fifteen she taught in the log cabin school at Fairview, when seventeen years old she made a confession of faith in Christ, joined the Baptist church at Fairview, and to the end lived a faithful

Christian Life. August 3, 1853 she was married to Timothy Soper, who afterwards became a deacon in the Baptist church at Fairview. Her life was an embodiment of patience, service, joy and faith. After the death of her husband, she lived in Anamosa, until last April, when she moved into a cottage home of her own at Viola. She leaves her two daughters, Mrs. H. P. Mundy of Viola and Mrs. Geo. Bodenhofer, of Anamosa. Her grandchildren are Mrs. Geo. Matthiesen and Miss Mabel Mundy of Viola Guy Munday of Marion. Her great grandchildren are Mrs. Matthiesen's two children and Guy Mundy's son.

The family feel greatly indebted to the Methodist church and other friends of Viola and wish to express great appreciation for all they did.

MRS. SAMUEL MOYER

Margaret Jane Wilkinson was born in Allen County, Ohio, June 12, 1850 and died at her home in Anamosa, September 7, 1931, aged 81 years, 2 months and 25 days.

She came to Iowa when a child of six years and made her home in Linn and Jones Counties since that time.

She was married to Samuel Moyer on January 18th, 1876 by Rev. B. F. Hills at the home of Daniel Moyer, Linn County.

Three children were born to them; Tressa C. Moyer, Emma E. Pavin of Anamosa; Mary E. Lienen of Center Junction, Iowa. She is survived by three daughters, ten grandchildren and two great-granddaughters, all of whom were with her to the last.

She was a member of the Christian Science church and for a number of years a member of the mother church at Boston, Mass.

She spent a large part of her married life on a farm 4½ miles south of Anamosa and twenty years in Anamosa.

Funeral services were held at the home on September 9th, conducted by Miss Twogood of Cedar Rapids Christian Science reader. Burial was at Forest Hill cemetery beside her husband who preceded her fifteen years ago. Pallbearers were Clayton Hartman, Harry Alspaugh, Lemuel Gage, Thomas Watters, Walter Pearson and Harry Holcomb.
