 15 July 1875 Anamosa

Died on Saturday morning, July 10 at Cass Center, of typhoid fever, Mrs. J.H. Atkinson, aged 38 Years. Deceased was the daughter of J.H. Fisher, Esq., one of the early settlers of Anamosa. She leaves a very extensive circle of friends and acquaintances to mourn her departure. She was one of those whom to know is to love and esteem. The high regard to which she was held was strongly attested by the very large attendance at the funeral services Sabbath morning conducted by Rev. E.C. Downs, of the Cass Congregational Church. The remains were interred in the cemetery at Anamosa.

UNITED CHURCH OF MONTICELLO: United Church of Christ-United Methodist

The United Church of Monticello came into being Jan 1, 1974 and is a cooperative parish involving St. Luke's United Methodist Church and First Congregational United Church of Christ.

Each church has a membership list and a denominational affiliation; each is incorporated and has control of its property, but by agreeing to enter into the cooperative parish arrangement the two congregations have agreed to live, function and operate as a single unit. One set of church officers is elected, and there is one budget and treasury. While continuing to utilize its two buildings, the United Church of Monticello functions as a single congregation, a congregation united for worship and mission.

During 1962 a remodeling project was completed at the Methodist Church (Sycamore and Second), and it now houses the entire Christian education enterprise. The majority of the worship services are held in the Congregational Church, (Chestnut and Second).

The Congregational Church had its beginnings in Monticello in 1860, under the leadership of Rev. E.P. Kimball.

The first building was dedicated Jan. 27, 1868. Cost of the building was \$4,000. The present church building was dedicated on Jan. 20, 1901. It was built at a cost of \$19,000.

In 1957, in Cleveland, Ohio, the Congregational Churches united with the Evangelical and Reformed Church to form a new denomination, The United Church of Christ. Since that time, the local congregation has been known as First Congregational United Church of Christ.

In June 1969, First Congregational and St. Luke's United Methodist Church agreed to share a pastor, and thus was begun the process which led to the formation of the United Church of Monticello.

It is believed that Monticello became a "preaching place" on a large circuit of the Methodist Church in 1851. Records indicate that a J. Williams preached on the circuit which included Monticello in 1861.

In 1863 the first church building was erected at a cost of \$1,750. It was dedicated on Christmas day of that year. A second building was constructed on the same corner for \$8,500, and was dedicated on Feb 11, 1900.

Ground was broken for the present church building in May 1949, and the first service held in the third building to be used by the Methodists on this corner was Oct. 1, 1950.
