The Express, Monticello, 29 Mar 1866

Died. at Monticello, March 24th 1866, Robt B. Ogden in the 47th year of his age. Mr Ogden was born in Frederick county, Virginia Sept 8th 1819. He immigrated to Dubuque County, Iowa in 1849, where he lived until the 6th of April, 1855, since which date he has been a resident of that place. When about 17 years of age he professed faith in Christ and continued a professor until his death, not having had an opportunity to connect himself with the church of his choice- the Protestant Methodist-- he formed no church connection in this state, although he continued to hold fast his confidence in Christ until the date of his death. He was a man of great uprightness of character, a practical christian, and a prominent and respected citizen.

LUTHER BERTON PECK 5 Dec 1895

That long time and popular citizen of Anamosa, L.B. Peck passed to the land of tranquility and forgetfulness on Tuesday this week. For a year he has suffered with what is vulgarly called creeping paralysis, which attacked his left side and arm, gradually crippled him.

L.B. Peck was a native of Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania. Was born 20 Feb 1837. His earlier years were spent on a farm. He graduated from the business college at Binghamton, New York, became a school teacher and had charge of a number of schools in Susquehanna County. In 1861 he came to Iowa and lived at Marion, where he was employed by his uncle Henry Welch, a wealthy farmer. Three years later he removed to Anamosa and became a dealer in general merchandise, which avocation he followed until 1873. During President Cleveland's first administration he was railway postal clerk between Anamosa and Clinton, and filled the offices of city assessor and city clerk a number of terms. He was a democrat in politics, an independent in religion and a man of more than ordinary ability.

In 1867 he was married to Miss Annie Gray, who survives him, five children were the fruit of this union. Henry L., foreman of the Cascade Pioneer newspaper; John who lives in Calhan, Colo.; Mrs D.W. (Bertha) Ellis; Cyrus, and Stella of Anamosa. The funeral was held at the family residence, this morning, Rev. Heald of the Methodist society officiated.
