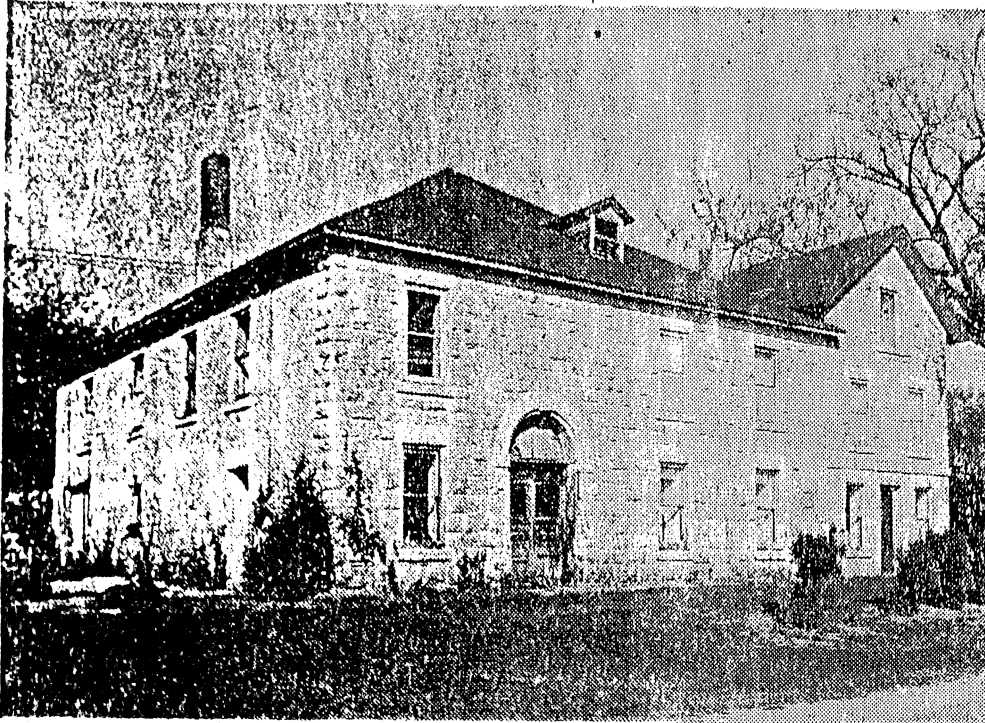

Historical Iowa--at Anamosa



THE MINNIE CREEK BREWERY

THE Minnie Creek Brewery at Anamosa was established in 1868 by Mike Rick, who on Dec. 19, 1867, purchased 1.7 acres of land on which he erected the smaller 3-story stone structure as shown at the extreme right in the picture.

This building, the Rick residence, evidently housed a dispensary on the ground floor. The brewery, it is believed, first operated in a wooden annex adjoining the living quarters. In 1872, this wooden section was replaced by

the stone addition, distinguished by the arch above the double doors.

With its entrance from the ground floor and at the rear of the building, a large cave used for aging the beer has been blasted shut. Part of the hoisting machinery remains in the attic.

The Rick operation continued for 10 years until 1878, when a bank instituted foreclosure proceedings. The property was sold in 1879 to Patrick Keefe. If he continued operating the business is not known.

Located near the city limits northwest of Anamosa, the property has changed ownership several times. Prominent among the owners was Charles Brown, who partially converted the building to residential purposes and made a show place of the grounds.

Present owners are the Arless Kasey family, who have completed the residential conversion and plan further beautification on the exterior. Mrs. James Burke, mother of Mrs. Kasey, was the previous owner.

THE CALL OF ABRAHAM

As with Abram (later Abraham) and Sarai (later Sarah) of old, who displayed a spirit of adventure, courage, bravery--but most of all faith in their God in leaving a home and people they loved and went to a land God let them to much further away than they ever imagined in their wildest dreams--so was Abram (later Abraham) and Mariah (later called Mary) who displayed the same spirit of adventure, courage, bravery--but most of all faith in their God as they left their "world" in Union County, Pennsylvania in the late 1840's and searched for the better land God was leading them to as He spoke to them.

And as with Abram (later Abraham), the ancient, our Abram (later Abraham) grew closer to his God following his conversion in 1845 and sitting under the sound teaching of his very strict Evangelical Church teaching. Perhaps it was on hearing what God said to "the other" Abram that our Abram got his "traveling orders and map outline" for his long trip West. Packing up what must have been a huge wagon train of belongings, friends, children, and some other relatives and future relations they left the home of their birth and headed west and settled in 1851 at Stevenson County, Illinois (Freeport)--thinking this must be the place. The birth of their 10th child, Charles Benjamin, followed the next year (1852). The next two children died in infancy--a sadness set in and was turned to joy the morning of the birth of their 13th and last child, Annette Grimm in 1859. When Annette was one year old God spoke again and again the wagons were packed, friends and relatives loaded and wheels turned to the West led by the son-in-law, Amos Kohl, and husband of the second daughter, Anna Mariah Grimm, who himself was a great wagonmaster and spiritual leader, How frightening it must have been when they came to the great Mississippi River and tried to find a place to cross. Having probably followed what is now Highway Route# 20 they finally decided--or should I say brave, wagonmaster Amos Kohl decided to cross at the place where the city of Dubuque is now. As a great and faithful leader must do Amos swam ahead of the vast wagontrain to the other side and onward to the land of their land grants in Jones County, Iowa near the towns of Morley and Lisbon, Iowa. How they thanked God for His guiding hand and His protection on the long trip to this wild west frontier. A church was established on the corner of Amos and Mariah Kohl's land, with Abraham Grimm settling near by. The church, White Oak Evangelical Church or Old Dutch Church was attended by many of the Kohls and Grimms. It was the first Evangelical church established west of the Mississippi.

As is the lot in this life, the sadness of death and the joy of knowing and enjoying the presence of Heaven gained, deaths among relatives necessitated the establishing of the White Oak cemetery next to the church. Some of the first ones buried in this small, neat cemetery (the church is now gone) were granddaughter Adeline, daughter of William and Catherine Grimm McCammant, who died in 1870--less than 1 year old--followed shortly by her mother, Catherine, who died while making soap outside on a windy day and her dress catching of fire, death being May of 1873. Others were: grandson Joseph H., son of Lewis and Rebecca Grimm Baker, 1874; granddaughter Martha S., daughter of Eli M. and Sarah Grimm, in 1874; at 2 1/2 years; William Riesland, father of Mollie Grimm and father-in-law of Daniel Grimm, in 1875 (he was also the brother of dear old saint Rev. Henry Riesland, who so diligently labored with the congregation of the Evangelical Church); Abraham Grimm died on February 24, 1890 at age 77 years, 4 months, and 3 days; Mariah Haas Grimm following on October 13, 1891 at the age of 76 years, 1 month, and 2 days; great granddaughter Cleetus Kline, aged 1 year in 1894; daughter Anna Mariah Kohl on July 1, 1896 and her husband Amos Kohl, the wagonmaster and spiritual leader of the huge wagontrain westward, who died on July 26, 1909. Others followed in the next few years.

There are other relations in this quiet cemetery in the country with a total of about 75 burials. This is memorable Grimm history and should be visited in quietness and reverence by ones who appreciate the example of our once and ever faithful Abraham Grimm, who like ancient Abraham was a friend of God.

Death of Miss Julia Farwell.

The death of Miss Julia Farwell is particularly sad, following as it did so closely upon that of her niece, Mrs. Jennie Bidwell, both members of the same household. Miss Farwell—Aunt Julia, as she was familiarly and affectionately referred to by her more intimate associates—died last Tuesday afternoon, after a long period of ill health. The immediate cause of her death, however, was pneumonia, which was contracted only a week previously. For nearly sixteen years Mrs. Bidwell and Miss Farwell had been most intimately and pleasantly associated as members of the same household, bound together not only by the ties of relationship, but by those stronger bonds of affection which are so firmly united where there is a sympathetic interest and close comradeship. In less than four days' time the one followed the other to the home immortal, where eternal spring, ever fresh and flourishing, succeeds the winter of mortality. To Mr. Bidwell it is the irreparable loss of wife and mother in one short week—we say mother, for his Aunt Julia was to him as a mother; she was the only mother he ever knew. In his infancy his mother died, and upon the aunt devolved his care and training. She gave him her devotion; her interests, her very existence was centered in his projects and his ambitions.

Miss Farwell was a high minded, intelligent woman, endowed with those kindly sympathies which endear associates, and which reach beyond the four walls of home. She loved the good, the true and the beautiful, and her heart turned with faith to the Giver of all good gifts. She loved her friends and rejoiced with them when they were glad and exulted in their prosperity. She goes to her grave leaving the world

better for having lived in it, and from its peaceful bosom "spring none but fond regrets and tender recollections."

Julia A. Farwell was born in Keene, Coshocton county, Ohio, May 21, 1831. She was the daughter of Zopher and Betsey Farwell, and the sister of the late Marcus Farwell of Chicago, Major S. S. Farwell of Monticello and Lalon Z. Farwell of Freeport, Illinois. She was educated at the Keene academy, and was engaged in teaching for a considerable period. She came with her father's family to Iowa in 1852, and settled three miles north of where Monticello was afterwards built. The farm was bare, unbroken prairie, and life upon it was commenced by the erection of a rude log cabin followed by the building of a more commodious house, and the making of improvements which made the Farwell farm a typical Iowa home, where for a quarter of a century, generous hospitality was dispensed, where friends and relatives from a distance, and the neighbors al-

ways received an open-handed welcome. Miss Farwell was an important and indispensable factor in this home. Her brothers having homes and children of their own, the care of her parents devolved upon her, and until their death, each having attained more than four score years, she was their constant companion and comforter.

She removed from the farm to Monticello with her parents in 1878, where they enjoyed the few remaining years

of their lives. Miss Farwell was a frequent visitor in the home of her brother Lalon, at Freeport, where she made many acquaintances, and where as in Monticello, she leaves a large circle of warm friends. She became a member of the Baptist church during the early years of her life, and retained her connection with that denomination during the rest of her life. The funeral services were conducted at the residence of the deceased this afternoon, the sermon being preached by Rev. C. O. Warner, of the Congregational church.

Washington Scott Dies.

Mr. Geo. E. A. Scott, an aged resident of Fairview township, died last Thursday. He passed away at his home southeast of Anamosa. Death was due to la grippe, a contributing cause being old age. Mr. Scott was born in Ohio. His age was 79 years, 5 months and 14 days. He is survived by an aged wife. The funeral was held the latter part of last week, and the remains were buried at Highland Grove cemetery.

Mr. Scott joined the Christian church at Highland Grove in early life and remained a faithful christian during his entire life. He was a devoted husband and a kind neighbor.

Death of Former Anamosa Resident.

Mrs. Helen M. Austin, a former resident of Anamosa, died at Marion on the 19th inst. Mrs. Austin and her husband, who died some years ago, moved from here to Marion about twenty years ago. At the time she was a resident of this city she became a member of the Congregational church, and she remained a faithful follower of that faith until death. Her maiden name was Helen M. Thurston and she was born at Darien, Genesee county, New York, June 11th, 1832. She moved when fourteen years of age with her parents to Kane county, Illinois, and on July 21st, 1848, was married at Dundee, Illinois, to Captain J. C. Austin. In 1856 the family moved to Jones county settling in Hale township. They afterwards removed to Wyoming and later to Anamosa. Mrs. Austin lived a quiet, unassuming life enjoying the respect and regard of those who knew her.
